

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

December 14, 2017 – 7:30 pm

The regular meeting of the Salem Church Council was held Thursday, December 14, 2017 at 7:30 pm in the Board Room. The members present were Keri Borchers, Pastor Tommy, Felicia Leonard, Janice Hoefer, Delbert Goetz, David Starke, Kevin Berry, Ronnie Begsicker, and Peggy Pragman.

President Keri Borchers called the meeting to order. Pastor opened with devotion from Luke, chapter 1 and prayer. Minutes were read, corrected, and approved. Keri gave the treasurer's report with balances of \$8,420 in General Fund and \$14,334 in Building and Grounds Fund. The Pastor's mileage of 500 miles for \$267.50 was presented for payment. Motion was made and seconded to approve the treasurer's report. Motion to pay mileage also made, seconded, and approved. We had received invoice from bank for payment of \$352.75 for property tax on copy machine we are leasing. Keri will check into this. Also our checking account level was changed from silver to platinum to off-set deposit fees.

The Pastor mentioned in his report a big Thank you to Sarah Berry, Angie Green, and June Howell for their hard work in constructing Salem's float for the Christmas Parade. Thanks also to the children and youth who rode on the float and Mark Berry for pulling it. This was the first time in many years that we have had a float and YES we won 3rd place. The fall congregational meeting to vote on the 2018 budget had to be rescheduled due to lack of a quorum. Pastor reported a good deal of consternation over this matter, but we should not give it more emphasis than it is due. Many have mentioned

this had never happen before, but Pastor had been told by an older member, that he remembered the Council making phone calls to get enough people to an evening meeting to vote on the budget. Counting both services on Nov. 19th, we had more than enough members present to meet the quorum. Many had to leave for family obligations, that being the week-end before Thanksgiving. Several members had to leave or chose to do so after the 10:30 service. It is something that happened and we will have to do some thinking about alternative ways to conduct the meeting but this is not a huge crisis. We will have the meeting December 17, after the 10:30 service and we will move on. Memorial Sunday, Nov. 26, with a moving and meaning experience at both services, and were blessed to have only six people to remember, which was a small number than the past several years. Out-of-town members had their visits for homebound communion on Dec. 14th and in-town members will be visited on Dec. 15th. Sunday School Christmas presentation which was last Sunday Dec. 10th was a success. Thank You June, for all the hard work and to the many children, youth, and adults that made it possible. We will have our Christmas Eve service coming up communion at 7, p.m., and as far as Tommy knows the regular services on Christmas Eve morning. Crystal and Tommy will be taking vacation at the end of Jan. He will be away on Sunday the 28th of Jan., and he will find someone to preach on that Sunday.

Steppingstone request for donation, and request for funds from Senior Center, tabled until Jan. Refund from Work Comp Ins. after audit, \$732.

Christian Ed: Delbert no meeting. Building and Grounds: David: Reported house numbers on parsonage taken care by Delbert. Padlocks are working. David has contacted several companies and contractors and is hoping to have estimates back to prepare an estimate for the Kitchen remodeling project. He plans to present it to the congregation for voting at the January's Congregational meeting. Cemetery: Kevin no meeting. Memorial: Peggy reported no meeting. Stewardship: Ronnie reported distributing blankets to those receiving home bound communion, and circles gave gifts. Evangelism: Felicia reported no meeting, but Super Suppers to begin in Jan. Worship: Janice reported no meeting. Ushers: Kevin reported Jan. and Feb. complete, working on March and April.

Anniversary Committee: Peggy reported things moving along with Anniversary Committee. The Calendar year of our 150th Anniversary will begin Sept. 2019 through Aug. 2020. Activities have been planned for every month prior to Anniversary Month. After receiving a suggestion from feedback from the church, which we were glad to receive, our theme will be "Remembering our Past, Serving our Present, and Celebrating our Future". The Scripture to go with our theme is going to be: Psalms 100.5- For the Lord is good and his love endures forever, his faithfulness continues through all generations.


Children's Sunday


